THE Clipsal 500 Adelaide motorsport carnival has resumed its status as the best of 14 V8 Supercar events.

The South Australian event, which competed against races in Australia, New Zealand and Abu Dhabi, was named Best Event of the Year at the V8 Supercars annual awards in Sydney last night.

It is the eighth time it has taken the award.

In 2005, the event was put into the sport's Hall of Fame, making it ineligible for the best event award for some years.

Now in its 13th year as South Australia's biggest ticketed sports event, it has won again.

The 271,000-strong crowd at the Clipsal 500 in March this year was a little under the record but almost 100,000 more than Sydney could muster at the championship-deciding final round at the weekend.

SA Motor Sport Board chairman Andy Ford last night paid tribute to the State Government support and work by the board, management, staff "and all South Australians".

"We have always had magnificent support from the Government and the entire South Australian community, and I accept this award on their behalf," he said.

Mr Ford acknowledged Clipsal as the long-time naming rights sponsor of the event.

"And we are fortunate to have an extremely enthusiastic and loyal group of contributors who take personal pride in the event," he said of volunteer officials.

"It is far more than a job. It's a way of life."

This year the Clipsal 500 welcomed the three-millionth fan ito attend in its 13 years. Since the first race in 1999, the event has provided a \$320 million benefit to the state economy - \$34 million of it from this year's event.

Mr Ford said the 2012 Clipsal 500 - now only 12 weeks away, running from March 1 to 4 - was well advanced in taking up its former role as opening round of the V8 Supercar Championship.

The theme is The Race That Rocks and its aim is to be another big-event success for the SA economy.

"We are determined to make it the best in the business," Mr Ford said.

The Clipsal 500 Adelaide has won four Australian Tourism Awards and seven SA Tourism Awards for best major festival or event.

Also last night, Roger Cook, who stepped down as Motor Sport Board chairman this year, was presented with an appreciation of service award from V8 Supercars.
