Well it's October already and that means it's Bathurst and time to elect a new T&CC committee. On behalf of all current members of the T&CC, we would like to thank the members of the club for their support and assistance over the last year as we have been implementing a few new ideas. We would also like to wish our all club members traveling to Bathurst a safe trip and a great event, we are looking forward to your stories upon your return.

As we are heading into the warmer months of the year it's time again to remind everyone to be prepared for the warmer conditions that we will face trackside. This is a good time to check your race bag and make sure you have sunscreen, hat, water and appropriate clothing for all conditions we face out at Mallala. In the last couple of day Supercars have released there 2018 race program and we now have 2 **YES** 2!!!! Supercar events in South Australia for 2018, so make sure you save the dates in March and August in your calendar.

Talking about the 2018 calendar, the **first draft** of the 2018 event calendar was released at the State Council meeting. Some notable highlights

- 2018 starts with 3 weekends of motorsport, R1 of state Champ, superkart/mod Reg and then Adelaide 500.
- 5 rounds of the State Championships 3 at Mallala & 2 at The Bend
- All Superkart/Mod reg events will be held at Mallala
- Saloon Car and Improved Production Nationals at The Bend in Nov
- Shannons Nationals may be returning to SA, maybe at The Bend in the first ½ of the year.
- All Historic races at Mallala in April.
- There are some good people making sure we have a training day at The Bend before their first race meeting.

The complete DRAFT 2018 calendar will be available at the SAMROA October meeting next Wednesday.

T&CC report (Cont.)

In 2017 we had 22 days of racing in SA, 2018 we could be looking at 30 days racing. This doesn't include any international event that they want to attract to The Bend. This means 2 things

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What is the Road Awareness Program?

The South Australian Metropolitan Fire Service Road Awareness Program (RAP) is a powerful road safety program presented to road users. It is designed to show an open and honest view of what firefighters experience on a daily basis when it comes to road crash rescue. RAP is presented to inspire and motivate South Australians and Australians of all ages to be responsible on our roads. In particular RAP focuses on drivers, passengers and pedestrians and seeks to actively engage and empower both new and experienced road users in relation to road safety. Through generational change in attitudes and behaviours, RAP aims to help reduce the carnage on our roads.

RAP identifies risks that road users take and the consequences they have no control over. An integral feature of RAP includes moving presentations from road crash survivors who implore the participants to learn from their mistakes. These road crash survivors find solace in sharing their stories and it is a way of making some good out of their otherwise unfortunate situations.

RAP is a powerful 100 minute presentation provided to businesses and community groups. Originally designed for 16-19year olds and presented in schools, RAP is now also presented to adult groups including parent groups, sporting clubs, community groups, correctional centres and businesses, including major national sporting organisations and AFL clubs.

Statistics gleaned from RAP presentations indicate that before the presentation, 75% of RAP participants classify themselves as risk takers on the road; with 100% indicating they choose to be responsible road users after the presentation. 100% of RAP participants indicate they will adopt safer road behaviours after attending a RAP presentation. RAP has a 100% return rate in schools, where it is presented on an annual basis.
