#### **T&CC Report**

Welcome to the April T&CC Report. We are now well into the year and most of us have been out supporting the Club at events at Mallala and The Bend as well as interstate meetings.

With all this activity on the calendar, it's important to plan your events well ahead of time so that you can support the Club throughout the year, so please make sure to put your name on the database as soon as you can to help with numbers and planning for upcoming events. You can always remove your name if you are unable to attend through change of circumstances. Please give some thought to supporting SAMROA events as we need to keep local motor racing viable and active in this State.

- We have a Fire Training on-line module for financial members on **Thursday, 22 June 2023** (time to be advised). This will be a prerequisite for the training day to follow.
- There is a practical training day on Saturday, 1 July 2023 at Mallala (time and venue to be confirmed).

As we have a lot of members that have never used a fire extinguisher, this is a good opportunity to become confident at using one, so when you do need to use it on track, you have the skills to be able to use it properly.

• We have an on-line Seniors' Training Course for financial members on **Wednesday**, **3 May 2023**. This will be about 30 minutes' duration followed by a Q&A session (time to be confirmed).

Some other courses to follow will cover Incident Management, Flag & Track and a Chief Flag Workshop.

Do try to take part in the above courses as they will build skills that you can use at the track, make you more confident and make it safer for drivers and members.

A number of issues have been raised by members relating to The Bend. These are being discussed with the Bend management and we are hopeful that improvements to flag posts and safety concerns will be addressed soon.

Do remember to fill out your performance sheets. This helps the T&CC in improving skills within the Club.

#### Our Members at the Grand Prix #1


#### Peter Millers's Grand Prix experience:

#### Our Members at the Grand Prix #2

Wow – what a full on 4 days it was! I was privileged to be selected for the Pit Lane and Grid team. My roles included Grid for Formula 1, 2, 3 and Supercars, start light panel or yellow flags for all categories, radar for Supercars and Carrera Cup, and was allocated to monitor the Ferrari garage when F1's were on track.

The Formula Grid role is a bit different to what we do usually for Australian categories. It is 1 official per car. We stand to the side of the grid box with a yellow flag and stay there until the cars have left for their formation lap. It's a buzz being so close when the revs are up ready to go!

If there is an issue we wave our yellow flag. If/when all clear then we climb the barrier gate to the outside of the track in front of the grandstand to take up our respective positions watching our car/driver and nothing else.

Instead of yellow flags we use an electronic device with 2 buttons - push green as the car is approaching its grid box – this activates a panel that swings out trackside showing green.

Race start be ready to push the yellow button if there is an issue – this automatically activates all the panels on the right flashing yellow to warn oncoming cars of a problem. Much faster and reliable than yellow flags.

On Sunday we had to do this 3 times for the F1 race due to the red flags and restarts. The final restart from pit lane was hectic. There were cars being shifted in the queue, team personnel, officials and media everywhere. We had to stand next to a car with a yellow flag in case it had a problem moving off – pit lane speed is 80kph so easy for a collision.

One of the perks of the job is at the end of the F1 race we have to protect the podium from the desperate media, celebrities etc. There is pushing, shoving, yelling and chaos. So we get the best view of the presentation and maybe a splash of champagne!

My final job for the day was a funny one. We had been stood down and I was walking against the flow of on-track public when I came across a spectator whose "mates" had peeled a large sticker from somewhere and wrapped him in it. He had wandered half the track looking for help. Some people had tried to unpeel it but the sticky was too strong. So I dug out my scissors from the bottom of my bag and cut him free. He was very appreciative! I am already looking forward to next year. The pit lane team are a great bunch of people with good leadership during some hectic moments.

#### Our Members at the Grand Prix #3

Well that was certainly a unique race... For better or worse I think it will be remembered for a long time.

We had the pleasure of being posted to the very first flag post at Albert Park this year, opposite Pit Exit and within sight of the Start/Finish line, very exciting!

Having the FIA feeder categories, Formula 2 & Formula 3, on track for the first time at AGP was a real treat, if you like open wheel racing and haven't checked them out yet, you need to.

A very special experience happened on Sunday, when everyone at our post was invited to stand at the front of the grid while the Driver's Parade was being arranged, so we got to see all the drivers making their way out and getting interviewed before being driven away with the crowd cheering, very cool! Being halfway up the main straight, we didn't get a whole lot of on track action over the weekend, the highlight would have to be George Russell's Mercedes' impression of an F-111, when it caught fire in front of us mid-way during the race, good to see it was dealt with quickly.

For most of the race our greatest concern was our exit strategy for the inevitable track invasion, which of course we then had to do while juggling final pack-down, Safety Cars, Red Flags and restarts, very chaotic!

Having to swim through the waves of people running to the podium was quite a feat, but we all got across safely with our gear, aside from 1 firey who dropped his phone (never found out if he found it again), and made it in time to be around for the podium.

As of that event I had not witnessed the start of an F1 race first-hand, I've seen it three times now!

Another perk of working up the end of the straight was being parked in front of the Ferrari hospitality suite, the staff were very good to us, feeding us barista coffee during the weekend and hot snacks when the rain set in, sadly their Sunday did not go well :(

We had a very good team, including several junior or first-time spectator marshals, who we made sure to give an intro to on waving flags. Watching how buzzed they got being out in the flag post made me remember why we do this, very special •

I'd like to thank everyone from SA who made the trek over to Melbourne, always makes for a special week getting to shoot the breeze after each day's events.


