Welcome to the June & July Report. The T&CC recently held a seniors online training module for any of our members who are either currently a senior, wishing to be a senior or simply interested in the role of a senior post official. The training went well with good participation by all, I hope everyone who attended got something from the session. Our next session will be the theory session for fire training, this will be mandatory if you are considering attending the practical training session.

I want to say thank you to those who have attended any of the recent race meetings. However, the T&CC and our Chief Flags are concerned at the decline in people coming to events which is putting a strain on everyone. In the newsletter is a list of the upcoming meetings for the next 2 months. Can you have a look at the calendar and possibly make yourself available to attend an event? We would love to give more people opportunities in various roles but if we don't get sufficient people to a meeting then opportunities are very limited. If you have any concerns about going trackside, or race meeting attendance in general, please contact a member of the T&CC and discuss your concerns. We will do our best to assist you and address your concerns. As a member of this club, a motor racing officials association, my understanding is you joined to be a race official, this means you want to be trackside. We need to provide officials to various club events during the year, not just Supercars, these club events are great meetings to learn the skills required, they are also the grass roots of the sport, not just for the drivers but for us also. We understand family and work commitments often need to come first for everyone, but we ask if you can give some time to the club by coming to our events and help out it will make the event run smoother, safer and be more enjoyable for everyone.

A number of people have completed online training modules including the Bronze module. The next step is an event assessment to upgrade your licence. The T&CC encourages people to develop themselves by doing these online courses, however we ask if you are planning to do the course and would like to have an event assessment at a race meeting, to have a chat with the T&CC so we can place you in positions suitable for the assessment prior to the event assessment. This is to assist you develop the required skills and also prepare you for the event assessment. We want to ensure you get the training, mentoring and assistance you need for your event assessment. We want all our officials to be successful and will work with you to ensure your success.

Don't forget we have fire training day coming up in July. As a prerequisite for the practical training day you must complete the online module which will be held in June.

Please remember to fill out your performance sheets. This helps the T&CC in developing relevant training courses and improving skills within the Club.

If anyone is available for the weekend 10th & 11th June (Long weekend – you can have a sleep in on Monday 😊) more names are needed for the SA Motor Racing Series, Round 2 – this includes a round of the Lamborghinis.

Could all SAMROA members who are attending each event register using the Better Impact portal. Please find below links for each event.

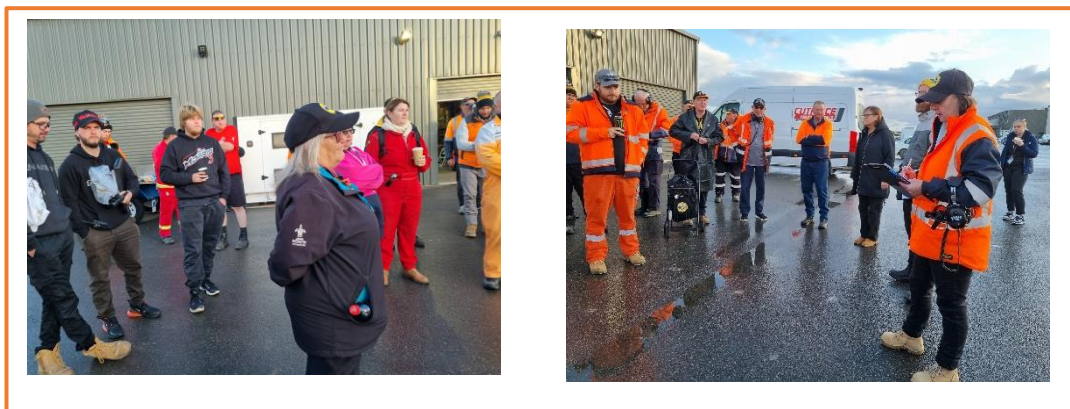

Our Members Travels



Alan Hardy – Bathurst 12 hour 2023:

The Bathurst 12 hour, what a great way to start the year. I set off from home on Tuesday 31 January for the drive to Bathurst in my old (500,000km), but much-loved Toyota Prado, with my camper trailer in tow. This is a trip I've done many times, overnight at West Wyalong and in to the officials' campground at Mt Panorama about lunch time on Wednesday.

This time it didn't quite work out as planned. I was making good time, just cruising really, when 35 km after passing through Hay NSW, the Prado decided it had had enough and let go with an almighty rattle in the engine. I knew straight away that it was serious and that there was no way it could continue – so what do I do now? There was no phone reception, there was very little traffic, and I was parked quite close to the edge of the road. The only contact was via the CB Radio, so I called for help and a very quick reply came from an approaching vehicle, a pilot for an oversize load who said he'd be with me in moment. He stopped and we assessed that the best option was to leave the vehicle and get a lift back to Hay and try to get the NRMA to come and retrieve both the Prado and the Camper.

I walked into Lugsdin Toyota in Hay, the NRMA agent for the area, and explained my predicament. Wassa, their retrieval guy, was with me almost straight away and we were in the truck headed for a 'lift' tow recovery back to Hay, by now late afternoon.

We were able to get the camper into the Big4 Caravan Park in Hay and I set up for a stay of unknown duration, but still with the question of "what do I do now?" I established my priorities for Wednesday morning – the first was to get the Prado back to Adelaide, I wasn't going anywhere until I knew it was sorted. I then had to decide what was possible for me, do I go back to Adelaide or try to go on to Bathurst? The head said go back, but the heart said go on.

I managed to get the Prado picked up on a retrieval from Adelaide, at considerable cost, and it was gone by Wednesday afternoon. The next question was "what do I do?" I was a member of the Facebook Group, 'Bathurst 12HR Officials', so I put up a post to see if anyone was passing through Hay who may be able to give me a lift. Sadly nobody was. With the help of Google, I managed to find a bus route that could get me from Hay to Bathurst on Thursday, but now, where would I stay when I got there? I had a site in the campsite but no camping gear that I could get there without a vehicle.

This is where the motorsport 'family' came forward. Almost immediately I had an offer of a tent from marshals already there and bedding from another marshal already on-site. There were numerous offers of help and support once I got there so the decision was easy, I'm going to Bathurst.

On Thursday morning I was up early and packed what gear I could take on the bus with me, packed up the camper trailer and set off to walk to the bus stop in Hay for the 7am bus to Cootamundra. The bus only had a few passengers, and it was a comfortable trip through all the little towns in the Riverina area of NSW, and 5 hours later we arrived at the Cootamundra Station and bus interchange.

After a 3-hour layover I was on the bus to Bathurst, via Canowindra and Orange, another 4 hour trip, arriving at the Bathurst station at about 7pm. It was a long trip but at least I was there. I was met at the station by fellow marshal Jackie Schlein, who had already collected my credentials for me, and drove me

to the campsite. Jackie and husband Andrew had already erected the tent for me on my campsite and a blow up mattress and bedding was ready for me.

I was set for the week to follow and was able to begin to think about how I would survive the next 3 race days and 4 drive days that followed. The support I received from people at the track reinforced that going on to Bathurst was the best thing I could have done.

The message I want to convey here is that in the motorsport community we are surrounded by friends, people we know well and many we don't. I was inundated with offers of help and support, but without the help of the following I would not have made it. I sincerely thank you for enabling me to participate in the sport I love.

To my wonderful wife Noeleen who puts up with my constant absence and spent this entire episode wondering what was going to happen next.

To Jackie and Andrew Schlein for loaning me the tent, setting it up and packing it up, and organising the bedding. This was the key factor in my decision to proceed. Also, to Jackie for leaving a dinner gathering to pick me up from the station, drop me at the track and then returning to the dinner.

To Trevor from Canberra for loaning me a camp stretcher and mattress which made the nights much more comfortable.

To Michael from Raymond Terrace for inviting me to dinner on Friday night, a most enjoyable evening.

To Maureen who drove me to the Hertz agent in Bathurst during a drive day lunch break to collect a hire car for the trip back to Adelaide.

To Lugsdin Toyota and 'Wassa', the retrieval guy from Hay. He not only did the retrieval job on the Prado, but he also towed the camper trailer to the caravan park and helped me get it set up.

To the Big4 Caravan Park at Hay. When I left the camper trailer to catch the bus they said not to worry, they moved it to their storage area for me to come and pick up whenever I was ready, with no charge. That happened 8 weeks later.

To the many other officials who have come up to me at subsequent events and asked how the Prado is. To answer the question, the engine was written off and I'm in the process of getting a replacement. It should be back at Bathurst for the 1000 in October.

I have only been an official for the past 2 years but the friendships I've made and the experiences I've had in that short time make all the effort we put in worthwhile. This is a fantastic sport.

A date has been selected that is free of events before and after the dinner. **The date will be 2nd September 2023.**

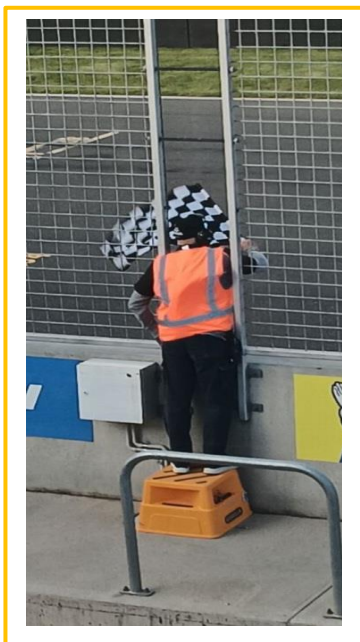
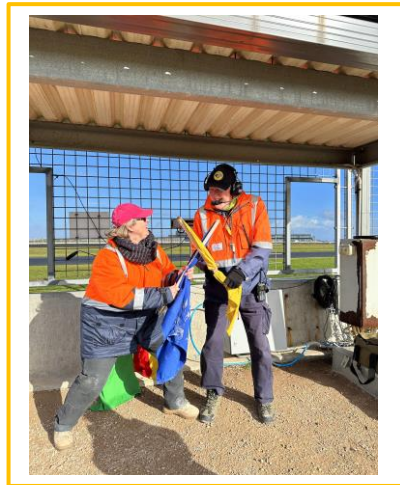
We are looking at venue options and once that is confirmed we will let, you the members know.

If you could meet anyone, living or dead, who would you like to meet and why? Valteri Bottas – that's private, Robbie Williams – singing with him.

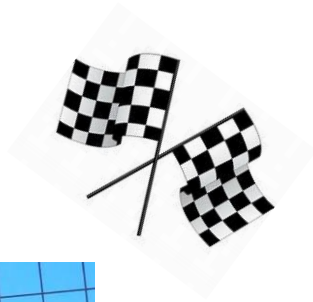

What's your most memorable motorsport moment? First time hearing a V10 F1 car also at AMF – Glorious!

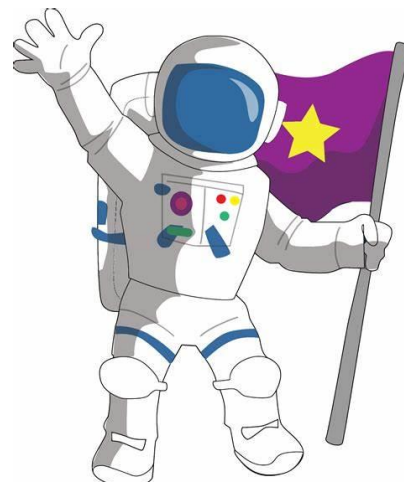
