T&CC Report

Hello everyone,

Yes we did have the Fire Training Day on the 18th July! I'd like to thank Women for Wheels for conducting the day, and also like to thank the 40 people who attended.

It was a very informative session. We began the day by having everyone signing on and a little quiz to see who could pick the fire extinguisher which wasn't supposed to be with the dry powder extinguishers. Well done to the people who spotted it straight way. It was a foam extinguisher that looked like and had the markings of a dry powder. We then had 30 - 40 mins of theory with Robin. Then we moved off to the lawn area where we had a 5 min stretching of the muscles to warm everyone up. I would like to stress this should be done at every race meeting at the start of the day and during the day at the flag points, to warm the muscles in the body and to prevent any strains or pulling of the muscles when you go to run to an incident or jump over a wall.

We then moved out to the back and started playing with fires. We started first with extinguishing standing fires which we all worked in pairs, then dry powder and foam.

We also had two of the fires lit using E85 fuel (no-one knew it was lit with E85) and it was put out with ease. So much for all the concerns with E85 fuel.

The only difference between the Supercars E85 is that the fuel has a green dye and is mixed with unleaded 98 octane, where the local cars are using E85 which is clear and mixed with normal unleaded.

Our next exercise was to run with an extinguisher, stop and pull the pin and extinguish the fire. This was left up to the members who were feeling capable of doing this, so teams of 2×2 were formed. So it was 2 dry powder, backed up with 2 foam to seal the fire.

It was noted that when running with an extinguisher that you would run at 75% effort so you still would have 25% of energy left to fight the fire.

We believe it was a well informed training day and enjoyed by everyone. Again, thank you all who attended.

We'd also like to thank everyone, including the new people, who came out and helped at the Superkart and Mod. Reg. on the 2nd of August. It was good to see the officials who had stopped karts on the circuit, get out there and push the karts off the circuit and get the drivers over the wall. This was all done using their skills to keep themselves safe first and also covering the flag points with the appropriate flags. Also, job well done to flag point 8, when the Mitsubishi Evo hit the wall at club house.

It has been brought to our attention we need to be on the look out in all categories, for vehicles pushing or forcing other competitors off the circuit or blocking or making contact, ie. Driver Conduct. There have been too many that we have missed. We need to be more vigilant. I know we all get tired and lose concentration, especially on an extremely cold or hot day.

We would also like to thank everyone who will be attending the HQ Endro on the 15th Aug, Unfortunately due to this newsletter being written before this event we cannot comment on the performance of everyone on the day, so stay tune to next month's newsletter.

One of the roles the T&CC is to monitor how everyone is going – their skill levels and areas where additional training/instruction/experience are needed. This includes our seniors/team leaders, particularly as we have some new people moving up in to more senior roles.

In order to try to obtain better feedback from team members, we have put together a new performance sheet, this is to be filled out by everyone on the flag point and given to the Chief Flag only at the end of the day. The idea is to identify areas where the seniors may need more instruction/coaching to help them along.

We also have modified the senior's performance sheet, which he will need to assess himself as well as assessing each team member on their performance.

To get your license signed off at the end of the day, seniors will need to have completed their performance sheets and individual team members need to have their performance sheets filled in and handed back to the Chief Flag.

At the August general meeting we will be taking nominations for the T&CC. If you are interested in standing for a position, you will need to be a minimum of a Bronze level license. Get someone to nominate you. This is an interesting way to see how the club works and how we train our members. There will be only four positions available for the floor, 2 come down from the general committee and 1 is the OH&S Rep, which is a total of 7 people. We meet on every 2nd Wed of the month at the Venuto Club, and our meetings start at 7.30pm.

Office bearer Positions

At the July General Meeting nominations will be taken for the Office Bearer positions for the 2008/9 General Committee. Here is a short summary of the duties of each position to assist people to encourage others to nominate (or to put their own hand up...).

President

The senior member of the Association, chairperson of General and Committee meetings and very much a leader. Responsible for contacts outside the Association, but these are often delegated.

Vice-President

Assistant to the President. Chairperson of meetings in the absence of the President.

Treasurer

Responsible for the financial records of the Association. Prepares a report for General Meetings and Committee Meetings. The job is straightforward, merely requiring the issue of a receipt for all monies received and their banking plus the issue of a cheque for all approved payments. Payments are required, to be approved by the General. Committee. Bank account to be reconciled regularly. Preparation of lists from time to time of financial members for advice to the Secretary.

Secretary

Preparation of minutes of General and Committee Meetings, keeping of membership records, correspondence IN and OUT, including responses to new membership enquiries.

Assistant Secretary

Preparation of mins. in the absence of the Secretary. Controller of merchandise and maintain membership records.

General Committee members

All of the above persons are members of the General Committee, plus FOUR others elected at the Annual General Meeting. The primary duty of the four elected members is to attend the meetings of the General Committee and of course contribute to the work of the General Committee.

Office bearer Positions (cont.)

During the year the General Committee may make appointments of one of its members to the Training and Competition Committee, Social Committee, appoint a delegate to the State Council of CAMS, to the Motor Race Panel and to the State Officiating Panel of CAMS. The person filling these positions reports back to the General Committee and as members know to General Meetings also.

The General Committee will make its own determination as to when it meets. The first Thursday evening of each month has been the timing of General Committee Meetings for the past year.

The requirements of the above positions may seem a little daunting, but they should not be seen in that light. Whilst they do require a commitment, committee members in the past have coped well with the work load. Membership of the group of four elected at the General Meeting has proved to be an excellent introduction to the workings of SAMROA and has enabled many members to contribute to the Association, including many relatively new members.

Please consider how you can be involved and also be prepared to approach other members if you consider they can make a contribution. A strong Committee goes a long way to making SAMROA the kind of organisation of which we can be proud.
