President's Report

Firstly, a big 'thank you' to Fran Tann (wife of our industrious treasurer) for volunteering to help edit the club newsletter. I hope you will all join me in welcoming her to the group of people who work behind the scenes to keep this club operating, and will help make her job easier by sending in material – particularly articles and pictures.

There are a number of projects in the pipeline at the moment.

The club (thanks to Andrew Leitch) has purchased a stack of chairs for the Mallala shed to encourage people to relax and socialise with a few drinks at the end of the day. T&CC Report

Hi folks, already a month has past and I'm writing another newsletter article. To start off with, I just wanted to make a correction from last month. I indicated the first aid certificates some of us have expired in November 2009. It's actually this year, 2010. So when we have the updated training we'll simply continue on.

You might wonder why First Aid skills would benefit you. Well, it's not only at a motorsport event you need the skills to apply all forms of immediate attention to an injury, but also in the everyday things we do and the common places we visit. It could be a loved one or close friend you save with your skills!

The proposed date for the update training day is 21st November 2010. Please add your name via the database ONLY. This means if you don't have access to a computer, then you need to contact me ASAP so I can include you. While a basic course normally costs \$85per person, this training session is tailored to address some of the challenges we may face in motorsport and will only cost you as a SAMROA member \$30. I need to get an indication of your interest, so please register yourself NOW!!

Since the last newsletter article I have two race meetings to comment on. Superkarts on 11 April saw Scott Chamings acting as Chief Flag. While it is a position of responsibility, it also takes some logistical thinking as to how you're going to apply your personnel to the points and who will be in the key positions. Bear in mind that is difficult to plan placements when we have a few people drop out the night before or simply don't turn up at all. So with guidance, Scott was able to manage the trackside operations of a club meeting.

SA Circuit Racing Championships Round 2 took place on the 1st and 2nd of May with Andrew Leitch as the Chief Flag and Tony Aloi as his assistant. Tony was selected to be given the opportunity to experience the role and to be actively involved in managing the trackside personnel, but also experiencing Race Control operations and the directives that the Clerk of Course may bestow upon the Chief Flag Marshal.

T&CC Report (cont.)

Most of the racing was pretty tame with the odd spin out and no heavy impacts until one of the Improved Production cars left a nice Oil Trail from 3 round to 5 and made the track like ice. This saw many competitors spinning out at speed which made it quite dangerous, but with oil flags out you hope the vehicles stay in relative control while all you see is a cloud of dust. Paul Hart was in Race Control on the "Flag Loop" and commented that the radio calls were quite good, with concise messages and expedient track clearances. Keep up the good work!!

Most reports on Flagging were good and the Clerk of Course commented on several points being 'on the ball 'especially when passing and lapping were occurring. There was a report of a driver indicating he was passed while under a yellow flag situation, but this was not able to be confirmed and therefore no action taken. **Be aware**, that while all drivers know the passing under yellow rule, some hope that they can somehow slip past without being seen.

This is where we come in..!! So keep a watchful eye even when you think all cars have slowed and are being compliant. Even if all vehicles have received the Chequered Flag, and may be on their cool down lap, you need to be extremely cautious of your actions especially if it involves any trackside work. And should any official go trackside, a waved Yellow flag is mandatory AND anyone who is trackside needs to vigilant in observing approaching traffic.

On Sunday we also had a British Motorsport Marshall come out and do a day with us. Graeme Fowler, who was here on holidays from the UK got an unexpected extension when the Icelandic Volcano Ash grounded most air travel and decided to experience a day of Australian Motorsport. From all reports, Graeme thoroughly enjoyed the day and learnt a few things about how we do it which I'm sure he'll take back with him. Graeme also got to ride in the course car which would give him a unique experience to discuss when back home. Hope you got a few photo's to remember your day!!

There are 2 positions vacant on the T&CC, a Secretary and member. So if you have any desire to be involved in the running of trackside operations and training, then get onboard. We meet on the 2nd Wednesday of the month starting at 7:30pm.

More on the CAMS REPORT (Provided by Peter Tann)

In addition to items reported in the minutes:

 Certification withdrawal – All 'Impact Racing' certification has been withdrawn as equipment has been found to be non-compliant with standards. Use of equipment with Impact Racing certification only will not be permitted at CAMS sanctioned events.

Why Do I Do This Again?

It's a question I usually ask myself as I stand trackside in pouring rain during the corporate rides that are adding an hour to an already long day but this weekend is the first time I have thought about trying to answer it seriously and not with the usual flippant remarks along the lines of my being a crazed adrenalin junkie. The incident on Saturday of the mini crashing into the spectator area has given me pause and a need to really think this all through.

I use up all my Rec leave and spend a few thousand dollars each year on travel, accommodation and food, all on a voluntary basis. My fiancé and I plan our lives (including our fast approaching wedding) around major motor racing events to ensure we don't let the team down by not being available. Being a volunteer trackside marshal is definitely not for everyone but there is something that keeps bringing me back.

Why Do I Do This Again? (Cont.)

I've been abused by spectators for asking them not to stand on the wheelie bin for a better view or not to sit little Johnny on the chain link fence just in case something bad happens or just for where I choose to stand to watch a race.

Promoters have run out of water, lunch has only been a sandwich and an apple, there aren't enough programs or pins for all the volunteers or there hasn't been a Portaloo trackside. I've raised concerns over safety for myself and other marshals only to have them brushed aside or seemingly ignored all together.

I've had ant bites, heat stress, migraines, fallen over on track and been treated in the medical centres of Qld Raceway, Indy, Bathurst and the Grand Prix.

At my first Bathurst as a Sector Marshal I watched my favourite driver have a massive crash in my Sector, the day after a fatal accident and just hours after an emotional farewell tribute to my other all time favourite driver.

I've had days when it has felt like Race Control is just not listening and keeps asking me to repeat things I have already said. There have been times when they don't seem to trust me to do my job and question why I have done something a particular way.

In spite of these negatives (and a few others that I won't share here) I keep coming back for more and I'm asking myself: why???

I remember my very first race meeting with two crazy guys cracking jokes and making me laugh but also teaching me that, when they move away from the wall, I should probably follow them.

I remember my first time on Comms, getting so tongue tied and mixed up that I was sure I'd never be given a radio again only to have the other Communicators tell me what a great job I did for a first timer.

I remember turning up to a V8 meeting at QR, getting my first Sector Marshal hat when I had never done the job before and being told they trusted I would do the best I could. (Funnily enough that was Turn 6 at Queensland Raceway, the very corner that started all this thinking!)

Why Do I Do This Again? (Cont.)

I remember road trips to Bathurst and all the crazy stunts, bad puns and silliness that help pass the time spent travelling.

I remember all the people I have met since becoming involved in marshalling, especially the fact that I have met the man I am about to marry.

I remember the care and concern shown for myself and others involved in the three major incidents by everyone at the track this weekend.

That is when I realise I have had my answer all along and it comes down to this - I love the people who, in spite of all the adversity and negative things that sometimes happen in our sport, keep coming back and committing themselves to get the job done. We may not share the same political or religious views and may not mix socially but we are all part of the "Flaggie Family".

I wish the public knew of the dedication these people show and what they go through on a regular basis. I wish TV commentators would have a go at the job first before criticizing the efforts they see on camera. I wish drivers, including so-called stars, would spend more than their compulsory time trackside to really understand what goes on.

I wish that promoters and circuit owners would stop taking advantage of the love we have for motor racing and treat us with the respect and dignity that we deserve. More than any thing else I wish marshals at all levels would start realising that we are fabulous people who deserve better treatment than we are allowing ourselves to accept!
