

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

SAMROA Training

As previously mentioned the T&CC is looking at training for later this year, in particular First Aid training

before November

Fire training is also being looked at as well. Will post more information when it becomes available.

General Training day also being looked at – report writing, afternoon split into groups going over basics, comms and seniors briefings, flag point setup etc.

Child protection training

We are having more and more young officials coming trackside which is fantastic, however some

are U18 and in lies and issue being U18 they can only be placed on point with someone who has done a child protection course. We are in need of more older experienced SAMROA members to do there child

Protection training.

This involves a quick online training module (Estimate 1/2hr-1hr to complete) and a 3hr course on a weeknight in the CBD. If you are trackside frequently and are interested please contact The T&CC.

Some things that every official need to be aware of and keep in mind while trackside!

Its very Important that ANY injury is documented - which means incident report written at the flag point and medical report (i.e. the person must go to medical).

These reports serve several purposes ...

- 1. Firstly, it protects everyone by ensuring that the person is actually OK or if not that suitable treatment can be initiated early.
- 2. Secondly, they are reviewed and common factors can be identified if something keeps popping up, what can be done about it ??
- 3. Thirdly, they protect YOU. If this (what may seem minor) injury flares up later on, then there is evidence that this injury occurred during a CAMS event and may be covered by CAMS's insurance.. Otherwise you could be on your own, particularly for medical expenses etc.

Also, a reminder for communicators to **LISTEN**. If an issue with a vehicle has been reported and confirmed, then unless it starts to deteriorate further there is usually no need to say any more on the matter. The Clerks of Course in the tower lane will be observing the issue and get the appropriate officials to assist. Also, sometimes things are happening in the tower that you may not be aware of if race control asks you to HOLD then (unless it's really urgent, in which case the word 'priority' can be used) let them get back to you.

Finally we would like to announce that Chris Hutchinson has now filled the vacant position on the T&CC

Matthew Avery brought up a concern which affects Officials working at FP1 / FP6 - there is no space available that allows someone to write up a report without having to move away from the point. (All other points have the concrete bunker that one can lean on whilst writing) What Matthew feels is needed is a fold up/down portable ledge that can be clipped onto the existing armco protection. Again general discussion led on to a delicate subject about illiterate or officials with learning difficulties signing on at a race meeting and being "fit for work" Ultimately, it is up to the Senior of the flag point to know his/her teams strengths and weaknesses and manage the team accordingly - this is somewhat difficult if there are only two at a point but we are all volunteers and should not discriminate in any way or form. Experience can dictate whether illiteracy is a strength or a weakness - one may not be able to write something down but that same person might possess a great recall memory so as to explain or draw what happened!
