

Who are the T&CC...

The club has a training and competition committee (T&CC) which is responsible for:

- the training, assessment and development of members
- the positioning of personnel and equipment at race meetings

The T&CC meets once a month to discuss training issues and place members in roles at upcoming race meetings. With this role, attending race meetings regularly is of great benefit as you have first-hand knowledge of topics under discussion.

The T&CC is made up of seven members, two of whom are appointed from the General Committee. All members must have a minimum of a CAMS Bronze Flags Licence (and be a financial member). The T&CC also incorporates an Occupational Health and Safety member.

The T&CC is also responsible for the management of the SAMROA Reward and Recognition Scheme, which rewards members for their commitment and dedication to the club and sport.

Elections for the 2015/16 T&CC will be conducted at the General Meeting on Wednesday 16th September....

Tarmac Junior Development Program..

This is a unique 4 day program that prepares young people for future motorsport competition.

Targeted Group

The Tarmac Junior Development Program (Tarmac) is open to anyone eligible to hold a CAMS (Confederation of Australian Motor Sport) Junior Competition Licence and the ideal age group is 14 to 17. Previous driving experience is not essential but definitely an advantage, however, we are looking for students who are passionate about motorsport and wish to compete in motorsport events.

Training Activities

- Workshop & Special Presentations
- On Track Driver Tuition Sessions

This will expose the participants to a real race meeting, learning the roles of all the volunteer officials and covering as much classroom and special presentations as possible before we turn our focus to driving skills at Adelaide International Raceway for Day #2 and #3. On the final day we have been given an opportunity to be part of a Modern Regularity come'n'try (TBC) arranged in conjunction with TrackTime Motorsport

VICTORIAN NATALIE DAISH CONFIRMED AS 2015 WAMS OFFICIALS EXCHANGE RECIPIENT

The Women of Australian Motor Sport (WAMS) has today announced that Natalie Daish from Victoria is the 2015 recipient of the WAMS Officials Exchange Program.

In conjunction with CAMS and the Singapore Motor Sports Association, the program is now in it's third year and provides an incredible opportunity for a female bronze-level or above accredited CAMS official to work in various officiating roles at the upcoming Formula 1 Singapore Grand Prix.

Thirty-five year old Daish – a legal secretary by day and mother-of-one – has been an active member of the Victorian Flag Marshalling Team for the past five years and is the perfect example of someone who has successfully turned an unrelenting passion for the sport into learning officiating, and becoming a role model for other women to follow suit.

With experience in flag marshalling at the Australian Formula 1 Grand Prix, as well as



flagging and communications at various V8 Supercar and state/club events, Daish has taken to helping new and young female officials come through the ranks and hopes the trip to Singapore will give her a more well-rounded experience in all areas of officiating.

"While in flag marshalling we're close to the action, there's a lot more to the organisational part of officiating that I'm really interested in learning,

from race control to pitlane, from gridding cars to timing and event scheduling. I just want to learn absolutely everything that I can about how

an international event like a grand prix comes together," said Daish. "When I started there were a few females but the numbers have grown the last five years. I enjoy taking young girls under my wing and getting them started in officiating the right way so to be able to learn some more skills will definitely benefit my volunteering back here in Australia. I'm just so thankful to WAMS and CAMS for the opportunity and I hope to be the best ambassador that I can."

Previous recipients of the WAMS Officials Exchange Program include silver level officials Michelle Luke (2013) and Trisha Davidson (2014), however in 2015, the program was opened up to also include bronze level officials for the first time. WAMS Chair Samantha Reid congratulated Daish and commended all of the women who applied for the 2015 program.

"The program this year was opened up to bronze level and above not only as a way to reward those who have contributed significantly across the board in officiating, but also to help support and encourage the next wave of female officials learn more skills and continue to drive growth into the future.

"Thanks to the financial support of CAMS, WAMS is delighted to offer Natalie the opportunity to represent us at the Singapore Grand Prix. She is a great role model, has massive amounts of enthusiasm and we know that Natalie will not only benefit from the added officiating experience but also be inspired to continue working with and helping more women back home," said Reid.

The Singapore Grand Prix will be held from September 18-20.
