

TRAINING TIPS

A reminder when doing your morning briefing with teams or with your senior marshal it is important to ask a few important things.

1. What grade of CAMS licence do you have?

It is important to check this due to the fact that marshals on Trainee licences are unable to go onto a hot track.

2. Do you have any medical conditions that I need to be aware of?

You should follow this up with if your fellow marshals are uncomfortable in reporting this to the whole team that you are more than happy for them to approach you later.

3. Do you have the appropriate protection from the elements / track?

Short sleeves and shorts are not great things to protect you on a rainy day and while they are good for ventilation on a hot day you should ensure that you slip, slop, slap.

Furthermore, marshals should wear the appropriate overalls, gloves and protective gear to ensure they arrive home the way they left.

The point is to adapt to the conditions, whether it is a 40-degree day where you need to keep cool and drink water to a 14-degree day with a strong breeze and showers where rain gear and warm clothes are essential to prevent hypothermia.

Mallala is very well renown for having 4 seasons in one day so ensure you check the forecast and prepare yourself the night before.

4. Flags and Hand Signals

It may seem silly but as we re-enter the motorsport season it is always good to reaffirm with people the different flags. And a great time to test the skills in regards to hand signals, communications and a few mock scenarios to prepare people for the day ahead.

TRAINING TIPS

Allergies are a common issue for many people whilst there are particular triggers for some people if left untreated it can be serious if not threatening to someone's life.

Most people who have severe allergies have an epinephrine which they can use to inject and control the anaphylaxis but in a marshals' context it is important to situationally aware of the team and ask the questions during your morning briefing on whether anyone has any medical conditions that you need to be aware of most will respond no but for the one or two that say yes it can be life-saving in the event of a medical emergency.

If you do see someone in distress it is important to get a communicator to report "Flag point ____ MEDICAL, MEDICAL" (Repeated 3 times to ensure that if race control or any other communication marshal is able to hear and understand that you require assistance.

Once race control has acknowledged your call you may provide more information and your requirements so they can scramble the assistance required.
