To make things extra special this year, around 800 Scouts chose to participate in the motorsport activity which took place at the now christened East Circuit (back end of the GT circuit). SAMROA members including myself (Lisa Totani), Darren Mattiske and Jason Thiele as well as members from Scouts Motorsport SA, Circuit Excel, Tarmac JDP and Track Time Motorsport had the privilege of taking these lucky kids on many passenger rides around this fast, flowing and extremely fun track.

The excels performed very well with an average lap time of 2:10 - to put in perspective, most of the lap is spent on the limiter in 3^{rd} gear with a long, sweeping right-hander in 4^{th} gear and a brief slow point in 2^{nd} gear. The activity was three years in the making and ran very smoothly considering that no event of this magnitude had been run before! Hopefully we will get the chance as officials to flag at this amazing circuit and watch the real "pros" tame it.
