### President's Report

The year kicks off on the 16th February with a SUPERKART / Mod Regularity at Mallala Motorsport Park. This will be a good event for everyone to get their eye in and gain some practice prior the 500. Hello, my fellow motorsport fans! Welcome to the 2020 motorsport season, I trust you have all had a good break over Christmas time. Can you believe it the Adelaide 500 is only a few weeks away!

But firstly, before we gear up for Adelaide, we have an event out at Mallala on February 16<sup>th</sup> Superkart/Modern Regularity. As always, we need more numbers for the weekend usually we have more than enough but unfortunately for whatever reason we are struggling. Please check your diaries and see if you can come and support some true grass roots motorsport this weekend. The Chief flag for this weekend will be Steve Clift and I know he would love to hear from you if your name is not already on the list. Big thank-you to those with their name on this list already, love your work!

The T&CC held its monthly meeting earlier this month and started to finalise and further organise things for the 2020 season. On Saturday the 15<sup>th</sup> of February the T&CC will be out at Mallala at 10am to do shed clean-up day, if anyone is able to assist it would be much appreciated and if so please contact me directly. We are also still in talks with Women for Wheels to finalise a date for this year's fire training which is looking to be set for a date in June so watch this space.

We are also still looking at a general upskilling course this year. Of course, we are trying to pick a free weekend that does not have motorsport by myself and the rest of the committee fully understand that we have life's outside of motorsport and we make plans in these times. While we can't suit everyone's schedule, we will try our best for a day that everyone should be happy with, finger crossed.

This past Sunday we held a Chief flag discussion day at the Sporting Car Club hosted by the T&CC's Peter Cirilo and Life member Rob Thiry. It was a day for the role of chief flags to be discussed with the clubs current and upcoming chief flags and assistants, run through some of the rule and wording changing that they need to be aware of two best help upskill every flag marshal. This also provides the opportunity for the Chiefs to ask questions and bounce ideas around about flagging, training and general race meeting standards and operation.

Tabled at this discussion was the new Performance sheets that the T&CC has created. Yes, I know everyone's favourite trackside task... but these sheets when filled out correctly play a vital role in the work of the T&CC. As without your input the committee can't accurately identify what issues or concerns you have while trackside. I ask you all to please fill these out as accurately and honestly as you can. We have selected the sheet with what we believe to be the right questions to hopefully give us the information we are looking for to further train each member and fix any issues.

Please note that as per the new FIA guidelines we will be as a club moving away from the term Post Senior to Post Chief. This is reflected on the performance sheets and the database will be updated in due course. There will also be a copy of the new FIA driver code of conduct added to each trackside bag for you to refer to if required while trackside. This should be very useful when looking a driver standard's during race meetings and make it easier to identify a breach of the rules when reporting a trackside incident.

Lastly, member Grant Sims has offered to organise the Wednesday set up day at the Adelaide 500. I will send an email out from the database with how to get in touch with him to put your name on the gate list.

Remember to look after yourself and teammates trackside, bring a fully loaded track bag and most of all have fun. That's all for now!


## WH&S Report – Deborah Squires

- Report hazards that need immediate attention that is, pose a significant and immediate risk to personal safety.
- Look out for each other
- Stay alert even during down time never become complacent
- Don't turn you back on the track
- Rotate roles when and where possible to allow for rest time. Dependent on numbers at post



#### Training and Maintaining

Take advantage of all training opportunities planned for 2020 and beyond

**Maintaining** your skills is a must to ensure optimal safety practices are being used. The easiest way to do this is by attending race events on a regular basis.

One of the biggest problems facing officials is fatigue and "burn out". Too often we have the same officials attending the majority of race events. For the sake of **health and safety** this needs to change.

I know life gets busy; however, without the dedication of officials being actively involved we run the very real risk of overloading those officials who are out there most of the year.
