- Identified more social events to bring members together outside the circuit; more information will be communicated following the AGM.


If you are interested in joining the committee and have your say in the direction of the club, please feel free to nominate for a position via the secretary.

T&CC Report

Hello everyone,

Welcome to the new financial year of SAMROA. This means a new year of training that will be coming and held by members of the T&CC. This training consists of understanding the chief and assistant chief flag roles, report writing, communication and other various roles. The main training that will start off our season is our Fire training and vehicle information day that will be held on Saturday 9th of August 2025, to be held at Ocean View College, Taperoo. The day will start at 10am and conclude at approximately 3pm. The fire training will take approximately 2-3 hours, and the remainder of the day will consist of viewing and understanding the vehicles that we see when we are trackside. We will have a range of cars to look at and their drivers who we can talk to and ask questions. One of the drivers will be the current Aussie Race Car Champion, Joel Heinrich. Lunch will be provided on the day as a BBQ. This training is only open to financial members, so if you wish to attend this event, please ensure you pay your fees prior to attending. If you would like to attend, please register via our SAMROA database. The date for cut off for this event will be 4th of August. If you wish to attend, please add your name by then as we need to know the final numbers for catering purposes. We require a minimum of 20 attendees to make it worthwhile for the drivers to donate their time and cars for us and pass on their knowledge. If we fail to get the numbers we require, this event will have to be cancelled and all the hard work and effort of our T&CC members and Peter Stevens in organising a place to hold this event will go to

waste. There will be plenty of extinguishers for us to use so we will be able to put them to good use by emptying them all!

What to do if you are running late.

It is important to be on time to race meeting events, so if you know that you are going to be running late, or your circumstances change, can you please notify someone as soon as you can, namely the chief/assistant chief. The reason that it is important to be on time, especially for the morning officials briefing, is because this is where vital information is passed on to all trackside officials before going to their allocated positions for the day. There will also be a post specific briefing at your allocated spot where there will also be vital information given to you by your post chief. If you miss out on these briefings, it makes it hard for you to know what is going on and to understand your duties. Being late, or not showing up, makes it hard for the chief/assistant chief flags to do their placings, especially when there are minimal people trackside. This can lead to marshals needing to work on their own or posts to be shut down. This then causes safety issues for all involved and makes the job harder for the marshals working on their own. If you are unsure how to contact the chief/assistant chief, their phone number is always on emails that are sent out, or you can contact the race secretary or a member of the SAMROA committees.

Also coming up is our AGM where nominations will open for the next T&CC committee. A reminder that you must hold a bronze license to be a part of this committee. If you wish to nominate yourself or someone else, please fill out a nomination form on the night.

SAMROA Fire Training & Vehicle Awareness Day


The much asked for and long anticipated fire training day is officially happening Saturday 9th August. We will be running this combined with a Vehicle Information session, at Ocean View College, Taperoo. As a financial member of SAMROA you are invited to attend the long awaited and highly expected fire training and vehicle


information session. The day will comprise of two parts.


Part 1 - Morning session - Fire training. This will include practical use of fire extinguishers under the guidance of Brad & Andrew. If you have never used an extinguisher before, or haven't for a long



time, this will be a good opportunity to "set one off" in a controlled environment, get to know how to use an extinguisher, what it feels like to use one, and gain confidence in handling and using an extinguisher. We have a number of extinguishers to use so there won't be any holding back.







great opportunity for you to get up close to these race cars and speak with the drivers. The session will provide you with an overview of safety features on the vehicles including location



of electric kill switches, activating firebombs, tow point locations, how to release seat belts/harness, Hahns device for helmets etc. Drivers will be happy to explain to everyone how to assist them, some of the dos and don'ts

of their vehicles and be happy to answer those questions everyone has to ask.

There will be a requirement to complete an online training session (Theory) on Wednesday 6th August from 7:30pm – this will be a theory based session and will go for approximately 1 hr. – this will enable you to spend more time doing the practical on the Saturday 9th.

Registrations are now open on the member database – this is required so we can send you a meeting invite for the theory session and for catering purposes on the day.

We encourage everyone to come along and be part of this training day. We have a significant number of fire extinguishers that need to be expelled so there won't be any holding back on the day!!

There is a requirement for a minimum of 20 people for attendance, so if you're thinking about it please put your name down on the SAMROA database today – Cut off for names is 4th August.

Big thanks to Peter Stevens for securing the venue for this fun day of learning and socialising.

Darwin Triple Crown Trip June 20205



Wow! What an awesome event to attend. If you have not yet been, or are considering attending, please do. It is a wonderful track and an even better experience trackside. There was a fantastic turn out from South Australians, and from our SAMROA members, which was incredible. The sunrise at the track is one of the best I have seen and is certainly a favourite among the tourists. The atmosphere is friendly and welcoming from the locals, and the tourist attractions are mind blowing. Whilst there, we visited Crocodylus Park...Boy, are there some very big crocodiles with very interesting stories to tell? We also visited the RFDS (Royal Flying Doctors Service). This is a must visit as it gives you a real insight into the incredible work they do for people who live out in the country and have very limited access to doctors. The famous Humpty Doo Hotel is a place you must visit when in Darwin. The food is divine, the people are just incredible, and the beer is liquid gold! It truly gives you a real sense of the Outback in Australia. The Military Museum was a new place we visited this time; all I can say is this is another must go to if you are ever in Darwin. I was blown away at the history of this place and was in awe of what I learned whilst there. This is a place I would go to again. They have also built a new area dedicated to the Holocaust. I have no words about how I felt going into this area, but boy what an experience I had. This opened my eyes and took my breath away at the same time as it was so interesting yet heartbreaking at the same time. Another place that we visited for the first time was the Underground WWII Oil Storage Tunnels. If you get claustrophobic, I do not recommend you go to this place. Another place of learning, fascination and memories. The information that is displayed is unbelievable and so interesting. The number of tourists in the tunnel was incredible. Seeing young children with their parents looking intrigued and listening to what they were being taught was something I will remember for a very long time. The Museum & Art Gallery of NT is a great place. I could have spent a whole day there. The displays are just beautiful. You will find Sweetheart, the 5.1 metre crocodile here. She is one BIG croc weighing in at 780kg! You will also find a dedicated area to Cyclone Tracey. Still to this day I am in disbelief about the damage that was done and the stories that were told by the people that endured such a life-changing experience. Last of all was our credentials night at the Darwin Ski Club. What a great night to catch up with your teammates for the weekend and fellow travellers who have now become your friends.
