The T&CC are planning on continuing to provide online training next year following the success this year. If you have any ideas for training modules you feel our members may benefit from, please feel free to chat to one of the members. The first module to be rolled out in 2025 will be the Chief Flag and Assistant Chief Flag module.

The T&CC are still looking for a member to join the team. Nominations and, if necessary, elections will be taken at the next General Meeting on the 11th Dec – for more information see article below. Everyone is encouraged to apply. You will need at least a Bronze level license to join the T&CC.

Bronze assessments – we have had a number of people ask how they do their bronze assessment. The first thing is to complete the online module via the Motorsport Australia website. Once you successfully complete this, touch base with someone from the T&CC, let us know you have completed the course, and we will begin to work with you to get you prepared for your event assessment. This may involve allocating a mentor, and placing you with senior people who can train you and ensure you are ready to undertake the event assessment at an event. The T&CC are here to help you have a good and successful experience with your assessment.

Expression of interest for roles in 2025 - The T&CC is once again seeking Expressions of Interest (EOI) from members wishing to learn new roles trackside. These roles include Assistant Chief Flag, Race Control, Form Up, Starter. If anyone is interested in understanding what these roles involve, please feel free to have a chat with any of the T&CC member.

A new tyre wall has been placed trackside from post 5 thru to post 6 at The Bend. This will assist when cars hit the wall, and for those who have had the unfortunate experience of being on post 6 when a car has hit the wall. Hopefully this will see less damage and risk to drivers and officials.



For something different, below is some general information regarding heat and summer. This information has been supplied by CFS:

Be prepared for heatwaves this summer

It's important to look after ourselves and others during periods of extreme heat.

There are three levels of heatwave intensity. Each comes with specific advice and may result in the issuing of a localised warning:

Low intensity: check on people at-risk (pregnant women, babies and young children, older persons living alone, people with health conditions)

Severe: keep cool, drink water, check on those at-risk

Extreme: take extra care, plan ahead, keep cool, stay inside, drink water, check on others.

Please pay attention to the warnings for where you live, work and travel.

Heatwaves can impact your health and wellbeing, and anyone can be affected, including fit healthy people who are working or playing sport outdoors or in hot environments. Take extra care of yourself and others, especially those with existing health conditions.

Help yourself

Stay informed, keep cool and stay hydrated. Staying well will allow you to help yourself and others.

Plan ahead and avoid any non-essential activities during the hottest part of the day (including travel), whether for work or for personal reasons.

Contact your GP or visit Health Direct if you are feeling unwell. For immediate medical attention, phone 000.

Help others

- Encourage family, neighbours and others at risk from the heat to prepare their homes for summer heat (for example, getting their air-conditioner serviced or making sure it is programmed to cool).
- Keep an eye out for any heat-affected and at-risk members of the community to offer them a seat, shade, a cool drink, or help to obtain medical attention if needed.
- Ensure your agency and colleagues are aware of and plan for work safe practices during heatwaves.
- Register at-risk people for the Red Cross Telecross REDi service (who will check on them during heatwaves) by phoning 1800 188 071.
- Keep an eye out for animals affected by heat. If you are concerned, contact your vet or call the RSPCA on 1300 477 722.





SA ASSOCIATIONS INCORPORATION ACT 1985 - SECT 30

30-Certain persons not to be members of the committee

- 1. A person who is an insolvent under administration must not, without leave of the Commission, be a member of the committee of an incorporated association, or be in any way (whether directly or indirectly) concerned in or take part in the management of an incorporated association.

 Maximum penalty: \$5 000.
- 2. A person who has been convicted within or outside the State-
- a. on an indictment of an offence in connection with the promotion, formation or management of a body corporate; or
- b. of an offence involving fraud or dishonesty punishable on conviction by imprisonment for a period of not less than three months; or
- c. of an indictable offence; or
- d. of
- i. an offence against section 39A; or
- ii. an offence against a provision applied by section 41B; or
- iii. an offence against section 60,
 - must not, within a period of five years after his or her conviction or, if he or she was sentenced to imprisonment, after his or her release from prison, without leave of the Commission, be a member of the committee of an incorporated association, or be in any way (whether directly or indirectly) concerned in or take part in the management of an incorporated association.

 Maximum penalty: \$5 000.
- 3. When granting leave under this section, the Commission may impose such conditions or limitations as it thinks fit and any person contravening or failing to comply with any such condition or limitation that is applicable to him or her is guilty of an offence. Maximum penalty: \$5 000.
- 4. The Commission may, at any time, revoke leave granted by it under this section
